Information Sessions

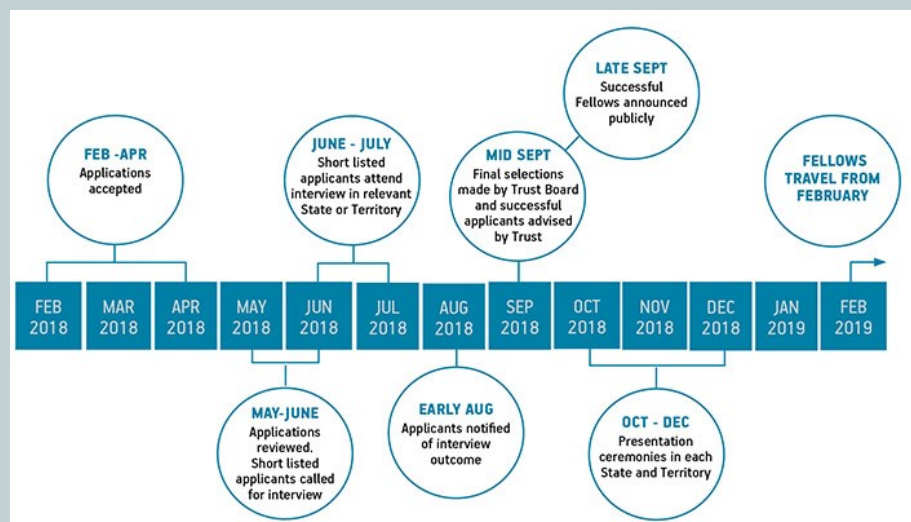
